Religious Education will support a growing sense of the child's awareness of self, their own community and their place within this. Children will encounter Christianity and religions and beliefs represented in the class, school or community. The Agreed Hertfordshire Syllabus for R.E. is followed in conjunction with the 'Emmanuel Project' scheme of work in Reception and 'Puddles' in Nursery. All eight areas of programme of study will be visited across foundation stage. Children will explore and revisit the Christian concepts of God/Creation, Incarnation and Salvation in Reception.







